

Electronic Visit Verification

Third-Party EVV Vendors

To be compliant with Section 1903(l) of the Social Security Act, as added by section 12006 of the Cures Act (Pub. L. No. 114-255) and further amended by Public Law No. 115-222, the State of Georgia will implement Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) for Personal Care Services (PCS) on July 1, 2021, and for Home Health Care Services (HHCS) by January 1, 2023. The requirements of Section 1903(l) apply to PCS and HHCS provided through Georgia's Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) programs under the following authorities:

- SSA Section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services Waivers
- State Plan for Georgia Pediatric Program In-Home Nursing

The Department of Community Health (DCH) is in the process of implementing a State EVV solution that can be used by Providers to meet state and federal EVV requirements. Providers also have the option to use a third-party EVV solution of their choice. The third-party solution must meet all mandatory federal EVV requirements and integrate with the State EVV solution. All costs associated with using a third-party EVV solution are the responsibility of the Provider.

If you are a Provider who plans to use a third-party EVV solution to submit claims for PCS services provided to Medicaid Members, DCH will need contact information for that vendor. DCH has compiled a list of vendors that may be providing EVV solutions to Georgia Medicaid Providers; however, this list may not encompass all vendors. **Note: The vendor list is for reference only and is not intended to affirm the vendors listed below have EVV solutions that meet state and federal EVV requirements.**

The table below represents the list of vendors with whom Tellus, the State EVV solution vendor, has initiated contact and their position in the integration process. A "Completed Integration" column will be added at a later date. DCH anticipates the first vendors to complete integration in May 2021 at the earliest. Signing the attestation and engaging in the integration process does not guarantee vendors will complete integration.

This table is up to date as of 5/21/2021 and will be updated weekly and posted on Fridays. If you do not see your third-party EVV solution vendor listed, please request that the vendor contact Tellus immediately at integrations@4tellus.com. Once an email is received from the third-party EVV solution vendor, Tellus will provide the vendor with detailed instructions, including the state and federal EVV requirements along with next steps to begin the integration process. Note: Tellus is the State EVV solution vendor and will be corresponding with the third-party vendors on behalf of DCH.
