SL: Third-Party EVV Vendor Integration Update

Dear Providers,

If you are not using a third-party Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) vendor to capture EVV visit information and submit claims, please disregard this message. Thank you for your continued support of the Georgia EVV implementation.

As a part of Georgia's implementation of EVV in accordance with the 21st Century Cures Act, third-party EVV vendors are required to integrate with the State EVV solution (Netsmart). Completed integration ensures compliance in advance of the November 1, 2021 mandatory deadline.

The tables below include all currently identified third-party EVV vendors in Georgia and their integration status. There are nearly 30 third-party EVV vendors who are or will soon be fully integrated in Georgia. If you use one of these third-party EVV vendors to capture EVV visit information and have registered for the State EVV solution, which is where you will submit your EVV-required claims to GAMMIS, your agency will be compliant.

If your third-party EVV vendor is not listed in the first table below, indicating a status of completed integration, please refer to your vendor's specific integration status to make the best choice for your agency's compliance. Please remember, if your vendor is not compliant by November 1, 2021, your agency will not be compliant and therefore, will not be able to process claims to receive payment for EVV-required services.

If your third-party EVV vendor is still in the process of integrating or is not planning to integrate, it is required that you use the State EVV solution (Netsmart) or select an alternate vendor. If you opt to use the State EVV solution to submit EVV visit information and claims for those Medicaid members receiving [PSS or CLS](#), the below checklists should be completed with those aides / caregivers who will need to use the State EVV solution.
